Safeguarding Essentials

What to do if a bowler asks for help Listen – let them talk.

Believe – take all disclosures seriously. Record - in their own words and ask them to check and sign.

Support & Reassure – let them know they have done the right thing to seek help.

Refer – take them to the club safeguarding officer if available. Otherwise tell them you will contact the club/county/National Governing Body safeguarding officer

Remember

Don't Promise to keep it secret – if they are 18 or over you can say you will seek advice without naming them.

Don't ask leading questions.

Don't investigate

Allegations of abuse against a club member

If you have some concerning information / concerns about the behaviour of a club member:

- Contact your club, county or national governing body safeguarding officer
- Don't investigate
- Don't keep it secret

Main Types of Abuse / Safeguarding Concerns

- Sexual abuse and Child Sexual / Criminal Exploitation
- Physical abuse incl. domestic abuse
- Emotional abuse incl. bullying/harassment
- Neglect and self-neglect
- Discriminatory abuse
- Financial or Material abuse
- Radicalisation
- Forced Marriage, Honour Based Abuse & Female Genital Mutilation
